

Computer Tips:



PC Performance/Speed Explained:

There are 2 main components inside your computer that makes it fast or slow. The first one is the CPU (this stands for Central Processing Unit) and it is essentially the brain of the computer. The 2nd one is RAM (this stands for Random Access Memory) and it is sorta like the brain's (CPU) short term memory. These are the 2 components to consider when you are purchasing your devices.

These days, with all that everyone wants to do on their computer, tablet, smartphone, etc... the numbers for these components are very confusing. It is complicated, but if you have a good computer technician that you can consult with before you buy - you will get the proper device. Don't be fooled by Internet Service Provider Speed, as well as low priced computers, tablets or phones - these are not going to be fast or help your device to be fast.

Electronics are expensive, I recommend you get something in the middle of less expensive to very expensive, in order to get a proper device that will function (if you are watching your cost). I, also, highly recommend that you take care of these devices - meaning, you should have them properly set up, maintained, kept away from liquids, food and dust. Also, they should be kept on flat surfaces safe from dropping. Finally, be sure to keep the power cords free from tangle and use the one that came with the device or buy a new one, if needed, that goes with your device.





Minimum wage workers need a raise. The federal minimum wage hasn't changed in a decade, and the tipped minimum wage has been frozen for an astonishing 28 years. And because women make up the majority of minimum wage workers nationwide, their <u>economic security</u> is at stake.

The Raise the Wage Act would gradually increase the federal minimum wage from \$7.25 to \$15 per hour, and then require that the minimum wage increase based on changes in overall wages. A key theme was to believe in yourself. "I wish I knew it was OK to apply for 'stretch' jobs — jobs where I couldn't necessarily check off all of the prerequisites but knew I would rise to the occasion if given the opportunity," said Kristen Johnson, a civil rights attorney with the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund and AAUW 2012–13 Selected Professions Fellow. "By not applying, I didn't even give myself a shot!"

Did You Know?

Progress in Congress. There was a 44% increase in women serving in Congress between 2012 and 2019 — and a 75% rise in women of color.

LA Story. In a study of 25 major metropolitan areas, the city with the smallest gender pay gap is Los Angeles, where women are paid 91% of what their male colleagues make.

Negotiating Change. When you're negotiating a job offer, an employer may not be able to provide the full amount you request. If that happens, you can negotiate for benefits or ask if your manager can evaluate your work product in a few months to see if a raise is possible then.

Two-Minute Activist: End the Student Loan Crisis

As of early 2019, women hold almost two-thirds (\$929 billion) of the country's \$1.46-trillion student debt, according to AAUW's report <u>Deeper in Debt: Women and Student Loans</u>. Women borrow more, and because of the gender pay gap, they also take longer to pay off their loans. "Student loan debt is very much a women's issue," says Kim Churches, CEO of AAUW.

Now 2001–02 AAUW International Fellow and 2017 Alumnae Recognition Awardee Tererai Trent — scholar, humanitarian and educator — has been named one of the 10 most inspiring women in the world!



In August, a life-size statue of Trent will be unveiled by <u>Statues for Equality</u> in New York City alongside sculptures of Winfrey, author Cheryl Strayed, Olympic gymnast Gabby Douglas and others.

Trent grew up in a cattle-herding family in rural Zimbabwe. By the time she was 18, she had four children and lacked a high-school education. As a featured speaker at AAUW's recent NCCWSL conference, Trent described her journey from poverty to Ph.D., and how she helped rebuild 11 schools in Africa. "Those girls will be the first to break the cycle of poverty. They won't be silenced. They are going to be champions of this world."
