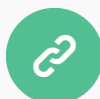

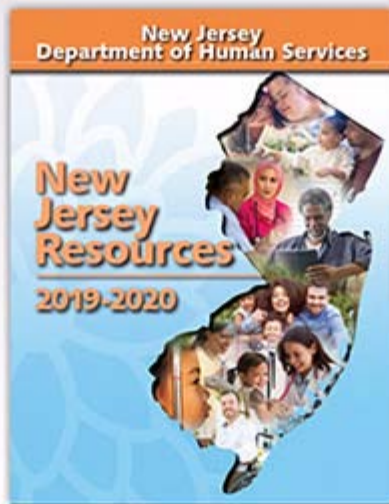

A key theme was to believe in yourself. “I wish I knew it was OK to apply for ‘stretch’ jobs — jobs where I couldn’t necessarily check off all of the prerequisites but knew I would rise to the occasion if given the opportunity,” said Kristen Johnson, a civil rights attorney with the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund and AAUW 2012–13 Selected Professions Fellow. “By not applying, I didn’t even give myself a shot!”
