

The PROSPER Act (H.R. 4508) is a raw deal for students. Urge your representative to oppose it!

The House of Representatives is considering a bill to reauthorize the <u>Higher Education Act of 1965</u> (HEA), the comprehensive law that provides students financial aid, ensures federal funding for colleges and universities, demands schools protect students' civil rights, and much more.

But rather than keep open the door to opportunity, the House's current proposal would ultimately put a college degree further out of reach for many Americans – especially women.

H.R. 4508 would:

- Eliminate student loan forgiveness for public service employees and alter income-driven repayment options, increasing debt burdens for struggling borrowers;
- Weaken schools' requirements to prevent and end campus sexual assault and support survivors; and
- Fail to strengthen the Pell grant program, which makes it possible for millions of low-income students to go to college, or even increase its annual grant amount to reflect inflation

We must fight back against this attack on access to higher education – and your representative's position will be crucial to stopping it. Click here to urge them to reject H.R. 4508 now!

H.R. 4508 would make higher education more expensive, more hostile, and ultimately less attainable for many. And make no mistake, this bill would particularly harm women's access to education. AAUW's own <u>research</u> shows student debt disproportionately impacts women, and Latinas and African American women are particularly hard hit. Coupled with the reality of sexual violence on campus, this proposal would only further jeopardize women's educational opportunity and economic security over their lifetimes.

H.R. 4508 has already been approved in committee and could head to the full House for a vote if we don't speak up. Tell your representative to oppose H.R. 4508 and any HEA reauthorization that fails to promote equity in education.




New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy has signed an equal pay bill. (Diane B. Allen Equal Pay Act) This act represents a victory for women in a broader movement against workplace discrimination and harassment, Gov. Murphy said that the law will be the strongest of its kind, setting "national standard" that sends a message to employers because they could be forced to pay six years of back wages. "For those who thought they could get away with paying a woman less just because they could, today is your wake-up call", Murphy said. This law will take effect on July 1, 2018

computer Help

Computer Tips:



On most keyboards for Personal Computers, you will see the "Windows" icon in the bottom left corner as well as the bottom right corner of the bottom row of keys (next to the "Ctrl" and "Alt" keys).

This is the same icon most of you may have noticed in the bottom left corner of your Monitor or Laptop Screen. It is known as the "Windows Start button and or just the *Windows* key". The icon (logo or symbol) has changed a bit through the years as Microsoft Windows continues to change. It used to be round with colors, then sort of wavy and now it is just black and white (in Windows 10).

Nonetheless, it is a useful key. If you press it, your programs menu comes up. Press it again and it goes away. If you hold the Windows key with one finger and press the "L" key you will "Lock" your computer. This just means that if you use a password to sign on, you will put your computer back to that screen where you need to sign back in. It is a very useful tool, if you are stepping a way from your computer and you wish to leave all of your work open so that when you return you can just sign back in and continue where you left off.
