Act — Take action on the most pressing policies

This month we're highly focused on telling Congress the final budget must include permanent, universal paid family and medical leave—and we need your help!

Unlike most developed countries, the United States does not guarantee this fundamental protection to its workers. No one should have to choose between their job and their health or the needs of their family. While the House Ways & Means Committee included paid leave in the reconciliation package, discussions are ongoing and changes are likely. We are at a precarious moment when key members of Congress could turn their backs on workers by abandoning paid leave. It's up to you to ensure that doesn't happen.

Keep the pressure on Congress by contacting your elected officials

regularly. The closer we get to a final vote, the more crucial it is to reach out. While the timing continues to change, the importance of your advocacy doesn't: Your Representative and Senators must hear from you every day until the bill is passed. We have a once-in-a-generation chance to change the future for all workers. This is the time to make history. <u>Act now!</u>

Learn — Dig deeper into the issues that matter

The Vote and Reproductive Rights

This year, a historic number of restrictive laws were enacted or proposed in two key issue areas: voting and reproductive rights. A majority of Americans support protecting and expanding access to both. However, through concerted efforts in dozens of states, legislators defied the will of the people. In 2021 alone:

- 49 states introduced more than 400 anti-voter bills, and at least 18 states passed 30 of them.
- 47 states introduced 561 anti-abortion provisions; 97 new restrictions are already in effect.

What are "anti-abortion bills"? Legislation that would burden individuals with medically unnecessary restrictions, including mandatory waiting periods, arbitrary deadlines like 6- or 20-week bans, biased counseling, two-trip requirements, and mandatory ultrasounds.

So what's the connection? There is significant overlap between the people who push for the strategies used to advance both anti-voter and anti-abortion policies. The right to abortion care relies on the right to vote-reproductive freedom cannot be protected and expanded if voters are prevented from electing just representation. Similarly, restricting abortion access marginalizes women and advances the agenda of those working to disenfranchise a broader population of voters.

In both cases, implementing enough barriers to access effectively results in an outright ban on rights. And because these tactics are primarily used at the state level, Americans, particularly women of color, now have unequal protections depending on where they live. Congress must act to protect our constitutional rights in every state, and we need you to demand they act now: pass the Freedom to Vote Act and the Women's Health Protection Act!

Engage — *Share the important work we're doing*

- In 2020, women earned 83 cents for every dollar paid to a man, about the same as prior years, according to our recent update to AAUW's signature report, The Simple Truth About the Gender Pay Gap. But that doesn't take into account the millions of women who lost or left jobs due to the pandemic. Read more about the devastating impact of COVID-19 on women and the workforce.
- October 21 is Latina Equal Pay Day, which marks how far into this year Latinas must work to make what white, non-Hispanic men were paid for the previous year. It's the last Equal Pay Day of the year because Latinas have the largest gender pay gap to close. On average, Latinas are paid only 57 cents for every dollar paid to white, non-Hispanic men.
- AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund applications are open for two grant programs: the Legal Case Support Grants (deadline November 15) fund cases in state or federal court that address sex discrimination in employment or education and have the potential to set or reinforce precedent for future cases. The Clinic Campus Outreach Grants (deadline December 1) are available to law school clinical programs in California and New York that address legal claims regarding gender equity, particularly in the realms of education and employment.
- AAUW signed on with 60 civil and human rights organizations in a letter to Congress supporting the Women's Health Protection Act. This legislation would protect the rights of pregnant people to access abortion care. We also joined more than 70 organizations in an amicus brief to the U.S. Supreme Court on the upcoming Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization case, which has the potential to seriously challenge Roe v. Wade.
- · AAUW joined letters on the Build Back Better Act to Congress in support of establishing a universal paid leave program, temporarily expanding the child tax credit, and making permanent the earned income tax credit.
